The lyrics to Danny Boy were written by Fred Weatherly in 1910.

Weatherly was an English lawyer who also carved a successful career for himself as a songwriter of some note.

The lyrics were first set to a completely different melody and the song proved unsuccessful. It was only when Weatherly set the Danny Boy lyrics to the Londonderry Air that the song really took off.
